#### 2. Timothy McNeil of WNYICC will Discuss 1115 Waiver

#### https://www.wnyicc.org/

-The state of NY got approval to set up 9 social care networks. WNYICC is the social care network for WNY. This is a medicaid program

-WNYICC is responsible for screening up to 400,000 medicaid beneficiaries in the region.

-WNYICC will partner with a broad range of community orgs and healthcare providers to serve the up to 400,000 medicaid beneficiaries.

-First is the screening process, then identifying needs, and determining eligibility based on criteria.

-Once eligibility is determined, an individual will be paired with a navigator to address all of clients needs, and see about eligibility for enhanced services.

-Level 1 navigation for clients who do not qualify for enhanced services, this is more limited and includes mostly linking/presenting resources to clients

-Level 2 includes enhanced services which go beyond level 1 and can include housing supports below:

#### **Housing Services:**

-Pre tenancy services

#### **Housing Supports**

-rent for up to 6 months

-Community Transition Support

-Utilities activation and back payments

#### Housing accessibility and safety

-ramps, handrails, humidifier, door widening

#### Remedies

-mold abatement

-Pest remediation

#### 4. Mark Mancuso from Compass House will Discuss Youth Services

Mark Mancuso discusses Compass house **Youth Emergency Shelter** with accompanying case management on 370 Linwood Ave in Buffalo.

The goal is to help the youth residents to develop a plan to help avoid homelessness. Residents may be running away from home or having other conflicts that make it difficult to live at home. Many residents come back to the shelter for support.

Compass House has a RRH program for young adults (18-24)

-Includes Taking clients through Coordinated Entry

-First goal is to house clients within 30 days

-Then follow up with intensive case management

-When clients are in the program, they are linked to services, healthcare, transportation, employment, and advocate for clients that need SSI.

-Goal is to make sure clients have all the things they need to become successful individuals.

-Once they leave RRH, they can continue to link through the resource center

#### **Compass House Transitional Houses**

-Transitional House is designed to help clients go from living on the from street to finding an apartment

-Compass House has two Transitional houses, one for males and one for females.

-No rent charge

-Average stay is 9 months, can stay up to 2 years

-Provide food and life skills

#### Compass house has a drop in center

-Drop in center (1451 Main st Buffalo): Open M-F during the evening 5-10pm, clients come to socialize hang out, cook meals, do laundry etc.
